The School of Architecture at Dalhousie University invites applications for a tenure stream Assistant Professor in Architectural Design and the Humanities, whose teaching and research focus is in one of the following areas: Architectural History, Theory and Criticism; Science Technology and Society; Public-Interest Design; or Urban and Landscape Studies. The anticipated start date is September 2016.

The candidate should demonstrate promise in research and scholarship in architectural humanities, as evidenced by a dossier of research and/or design accomplishment, and show evidence of ability to teach design studio. A PhD and a professional degree in architecture (e.g. BArch or MArch or equivalent) are required.

The successful candidate will be expected to teach architectural design studio, undergraduate lecture courses in architectural history and theory, graduate seminars in their specialty, and advance the discipline through research and/or practice. We are seeking a person who is interested in working with colleagues to develop and deliver a shared curriculum.

Dalhousie University is located in downtown Halifax, a coastal city of 390,000 and the metropolitan centre of Atlantic Canada. With 15,000 undergraduate students, 3,500 graduate students, and 1,100 faculty members, Dalhousie is the leading research university in the region. The School of Architecture, established in 1961, offers an accredited professional program that leads to a Master of Architecture degree. The program has a strong orientation toward design and innovation in Atlantic communities and abroad. Co-op work terms enable our 250 students to work in architectural offices around the world, integrating professional experience and academic study. We also have a post-professional Master of Environmental Design Studies (MEDS) Design-Build programme and an interdisciplinary PhD.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority. Dalhousie University is committed to fostering a collegial culture grounded in diversity and inclusiveness. The university encourages applications from qualified Aboriginal people, persons with a disability, racially visible persons, women, persons of minority sexual orientations and gender identities, and all qualified candidates who would contribute to the diversity of our community.

Applications should include: (1) a statement of teaching and research/practice orientation; (2) a full curriculum vitae including address, telephone and e-mail; (3) a portfolio including design and research work, publications, and teaching; and (4) the names of four references and their contact information.
